Transition from Diocesan Ministry Fund (DMF) to Advancing Missionary Disciples (AMD)

A major realignment of our financial structure around the Spirituality of Stewardship began in 2021.

What is AMD?

Advancing Ministry Discipleship

In April 2021, our diocese changed its stewardship model from the DMF assessment to a completely parish-based stewardship model. This was a strategic plan to realign the financial structure around the spirituality of stewardship. Stewardship starts with the personal experience of Jesus. The following of Christ as a disciple entails a personal response. The examples of work, services and ministries of the church as promoting good stewardship include evangelization and witness to the Gospel, catechesis, and the faith formation central to our mission. Your gifts formerly offered to the DMF will now be given directly to your parish, because that is where discipleship takes place. You are a vital part of God's vision for the future of our diocese.

Where does the money go?

The AMD money helps the Bishop in the works of the Diocese of Pueblo. The money helps to keep the faithful connected with the life of the Church through the coordination of clergy conferences, the annual Convocation and The Little Way magazine. A portion of AMD is distributed directly to parishes, and Catholic schools to assist with religious education programs. AMD also supports other faith formation opportunities, marriage preparation, vocational discernment, and multicultural outreach.

Catholic Pastoral Center (CPC)

AMD funds help the diocese to train parish leaders, and provide support to parishes across the diocese.
